Read to "and now our story" Children write a prediction. What is the story going to be about? How do you know. Write a prediction using subordination and co-ordination. Although I think there might be a happy ending..."</p> <p>3. INDEPENDENT: Focus on the troll. How does the dog feel about the troll? How do you know? What do you think the troll is actually like? Children to write a character description of their troll.</p> <p>4. How does the story make you feel after seeing the troll.
