

## The Orchard School Action Plan – Subject: Computing 2022-2023

### Improvement Targets

1. To identify key knowledge, skills and vocabulary taught across the curriculum and build in opportunities for recall and retrieval
2. To ensure that online safety is taught discreetly in computing lessons and that children can identify what they need to do to stay safe online
3. To embed new hardware to support the teaching of computing and promote cross curricula links.

### Success Criteria

- 95%+ children to achieve end of KS1 expectations for computing
- Pupils to demonstrate safe use of technology throughout the school
- Pupils to explain steps to make themselves safe when using technology / the internet
- Teachers to deliver consistent, well planned computing lessons using scheme of work and any relevant websites / resources.
