Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a busy week here at The Orchard and I can't quite believe that we are heading in to our last week of the half term already. We thought our mental health this week and did some activities about how to look after ourselves and our emotions and thinking. Year 2 have been writing the most brilliant stories about the Storm Whale this week. They have been thinking about how to make their writing interesting by using adjectives and how they can move the story onward by using different time starters. They have also been learning about keeping teeth healthy and have made predictions about the effect of different liquids on eggshell. They will be using eggshell in their investigation as, like teeth, it contains a high percentage of calcium. However, there are rather a lot of wobbly teeth in Year 2 at the moment so I bet we could have enough teeth by next week to do the experiment with real teeth! I wonder what effect the coca cola will have?



Reception children have been using the hall today to move around like mythical creatures such as dragons, unicorn and fairies. They used the space really creatively and thought about their speed and direction. They have also been learning about the seasons and what each one is like and how it effects humans when we experience the different seasons.



Year 1 have also been thinking about the seasons and have been getting very autumnal with their crafts. They have been writing facts about famous people and have learnt about Marcus Rashford, Ellie Simmonds and Tim Peake. In maths they have been exploring the idea of 'wholes' and 'parts' and they have also been creating adverts to show off the wonderful crockery that they made out of clay.



In other news....work still continues with our decarbonisation project and there will much going in half term to make sure we are all ready for the wintry weather. Fingers crossed that the cold weather doesn't arrive too quickly though. Our new reading books have all been ordered and we are really hoping that they arrive next week. We will keep you posted.
