This week all the children have been learning about their rights as children, the NSPCC, Childline and how important it is to **SPEAK OUT AND STAY SAFE**.



Children met 'Buddy' who helps them to remember what they should do if they are worried. Please see my additional letter about the programme. We have also carried out pupil surveys this week to find out how the children feel about their learning, their class and the adults that work with them and the school as a whole. As part of the survey we ask children about whether they feel safe at school and we have asked all children to identify a trusted adult that they can talk to in and out of school. I will let you know the results of the survey when we have them all back from each class.

In our learning this week.......

Year 1 children have been linking shapes together in their gymnastic sequences, observing changes in materials when they are heated or cooled, and thinking about being safe around medicines in PSHE&RSE Year 2 children have been solving challenging subtraction equations in maths (lots of exchanging going on!), reflecting on their trip to Wisley by writing some lovely recounts, and comparing England to India.

Reception children sadly said goodbye to the ducklings today. They have had such a great time with them: writing letters to the farmer, creating rule posters about how to care for them, writing stories about the ducklings' adventures and, of course, having lots of cuddles.

21st March Event for Smart phone free childhood campaign



Keep Running Gingerbread Man




This bright and colourful book helps parents and children to share and explore how it feels to be in the middle of "one of those days" using humour and warmth to navigate "a wobbler".
