

Attendance Expectations

What YOU must do:

- Children should arrive **on time** to school each day. Doors to classrooms close at **8:55am**. Persistent late arrivals will be monitored.
- Try to telephone the school from 8:30am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments you may be asked to provide appointment cards/letters etc.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival (unless they have experienced vomiting or diarrhoea, in which case, please keep them off school for 48 hours).
- Prolonged illness/absence (e.g. 5 days or more) will require evidence from a doctor.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare

Penalty Notices

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
