#### Dear Parents / Carers

We have had a great week here at The Orchard. The children have been learning about Road Safety and know important saftey rules to follow:



I have told them that "Kids Know Best" so don't be surprised if you get a few reminders from them about how to be near the roads!

Year 2 children have been writing to Orion a little boy in a book called Orion and the Dark by Emma Yarlett. Orion is afraid of lots of things including the dark so the children have been giving him some very thoughtful advice. The children have also been learning about the Nativity story through art and the symbolism within them.





**Year 1** children have been creating art in the style of Arcimboldo. In Yellow Bay this week they experimented with melting ice and also made split-pin penguins.

Sam says that we need to help the environment because if we don't then the animals will become extinct. Sam also suggests people read this book if they want to learn how to look after the world.


