Reception children have had fun this week decorating biscuits and making giant bugs all with a ladybird theme after reading 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson and Lydia Monks. They have been counting ladybird spots and writing messages to the ladybird in our messaging centre.

The children have also been thinking about 'belonging' and that they belong to different groups in different ways. We are glad that they belong to the Orchard 3.

In PSHE, Year 1 were discussing how it feels when you are proud of something. They each received a special message from their teacher about something that their teacher is proud of them for doing or being. Their little faces lit up.
