

Dear Parents / Carers

It was lovely to see the way the children expressed themselves in their dress today. All week we have been focus on children's mental health and the children have taken part in various live streaming sessions with other children around the country, class activities or assemblies where they are developing their understanding that their voice matters and how important to positive mental health are the attributes of kindness, resilience and gratitude.

Year 1 have been writing non-chronological reports about emperor penguins including those special features of non-fiction writing. Stories have been featuring in their maths as they continue to learn about subtraction and thinking in terms of 'first, then and now'.



e.g. **First** there were 10 chocolate chip cookies on the staffroom table. **Then** Mrs Cary ate 6 of them. **Now** there are 4 left.

In computing this week, both **Years 1 and 2** have been learning how to programme robots and our Beebots have been scampering about all over the place. Here is a photo of some of Beech class who designed and made a road/course and then had to programme the Beebot to navigate it. In maths, the **Year 2s** have been making connections between

it. In maths, the **Year 2s** have been making connections between multiplication and division and learning to group and share numbers. After half term the Year 2 children will be learning to play the recorder. The recorders have been very kindly provided by our PTA.



In **Reception**, children have been recycling materials to make plants and

flowers. They have also been comparing numbers and thinking about 'equals', 'more than' and 'fewer than'. In PE the children have been linking movements together with control and co-ordination and then repeating them to make a continuous 'journey'.

We have received some information in our weekly Surrey Schools' bulletin about the rise in cases of measles.

'Cases of measles are rising across England, including among children. It's an infection that spreads very easily and for some people can cause serious problems. The uptake of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccination programme in the UK has fallen to the lowest level in a decade. There is a high risk that outbreaks of measles will be seen in unvaccinated individuals and communities in Surrey over the coming months.'


